

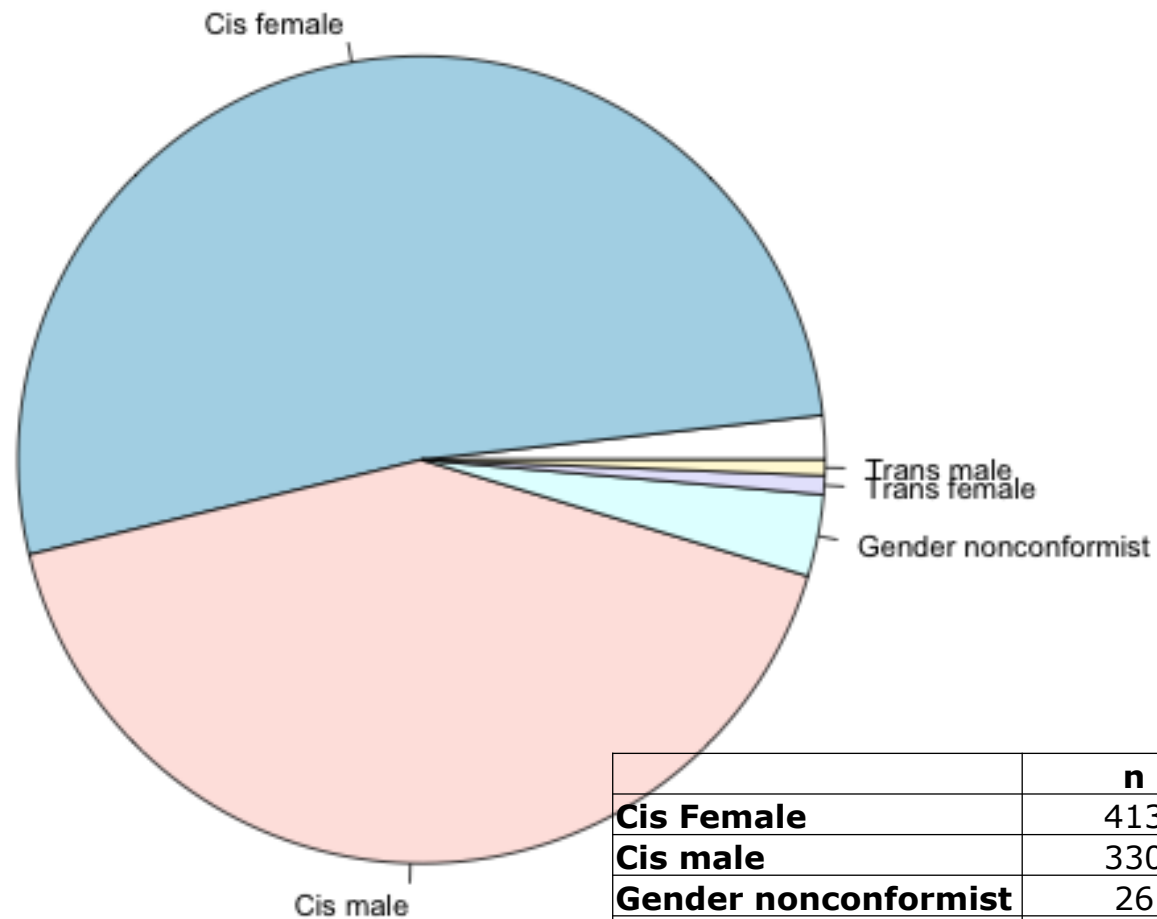

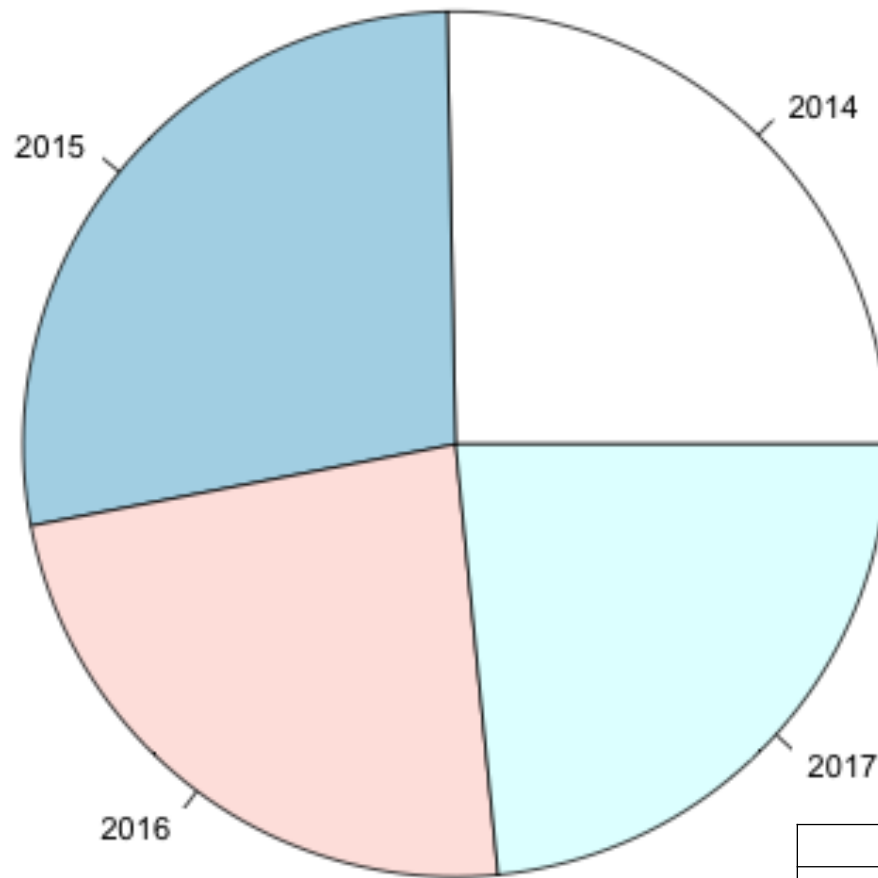

Gender Identity



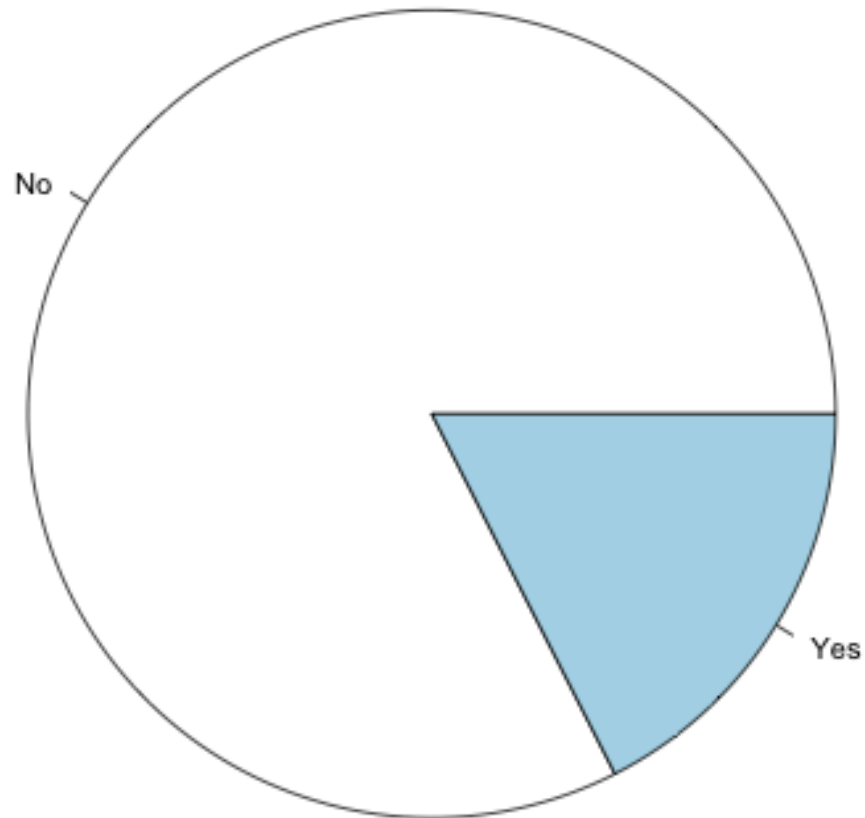

“How safe do you feel in fraternity spaces during parties compared to other party spaces on campus?”

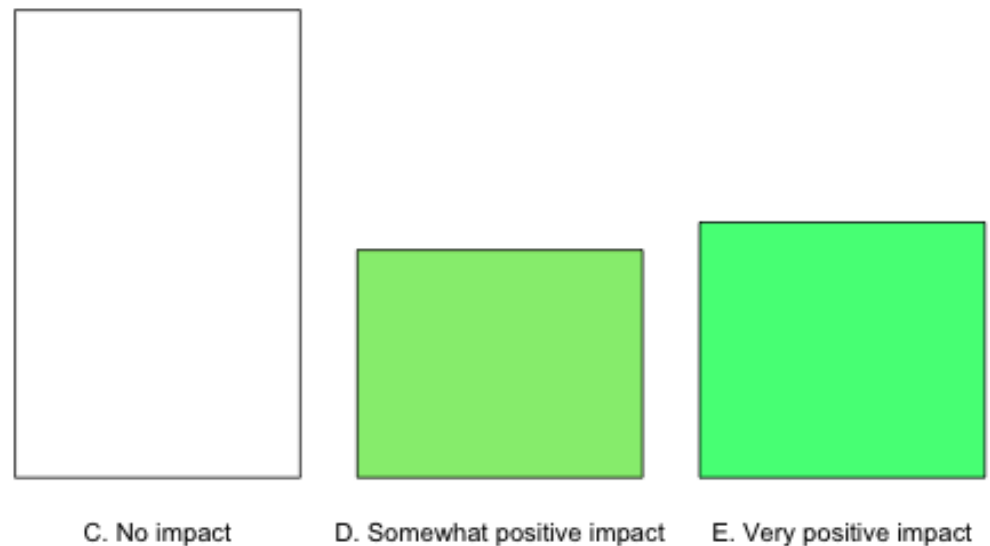

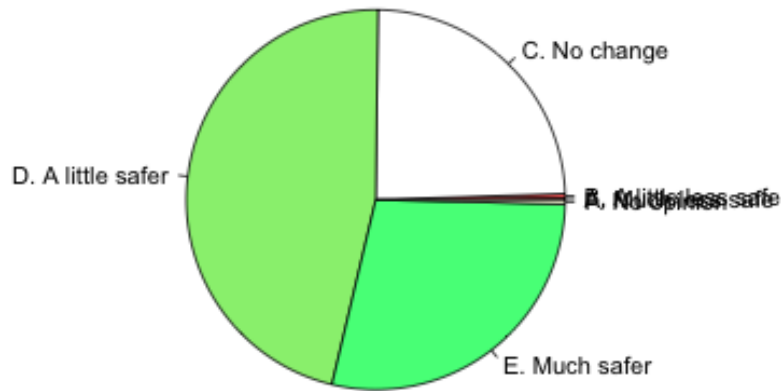
“What impact do you think the existence of fraternity spaces has on gender relations and gender equality on campus?”



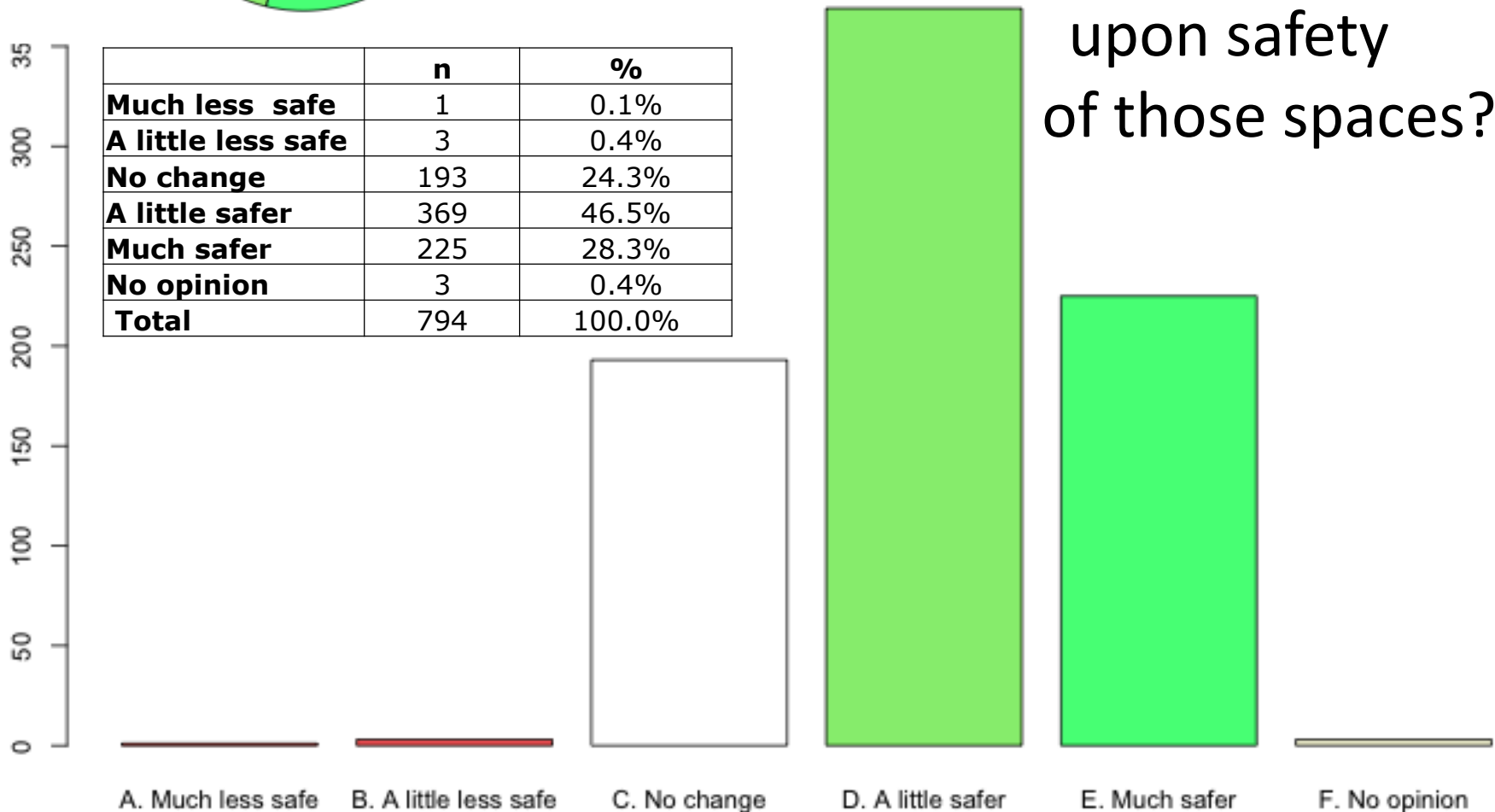

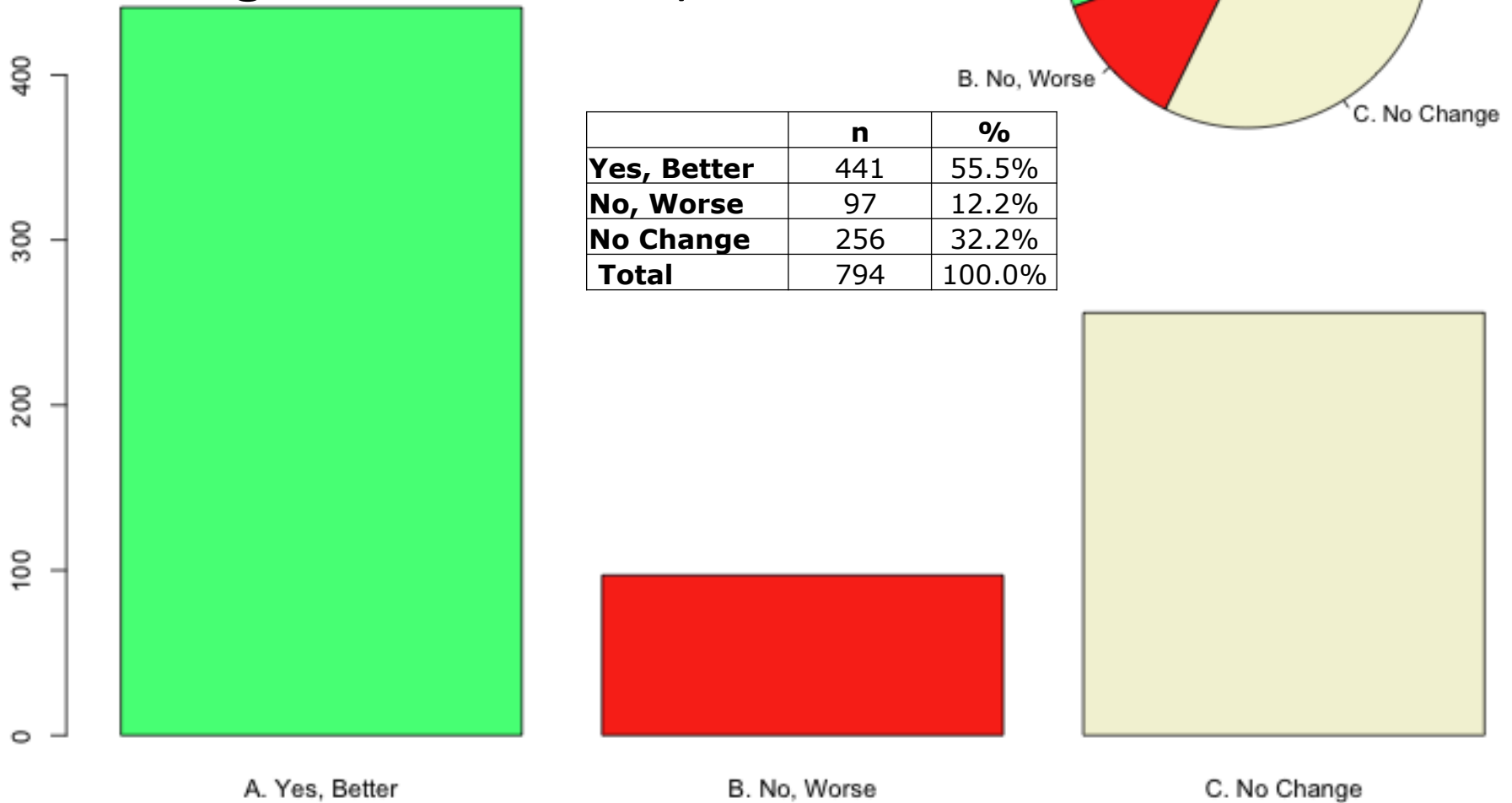
“What would be the impact of increased training (consent, bystander intervention) of fraternities upon safety of those spaces?”

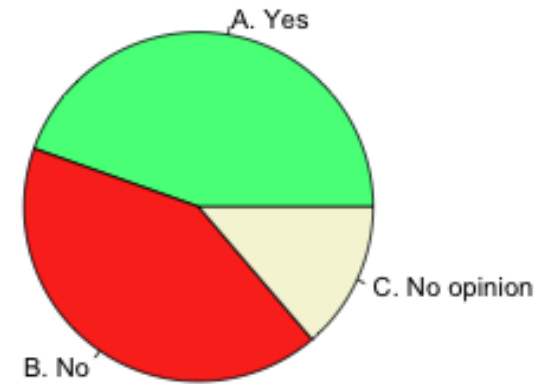
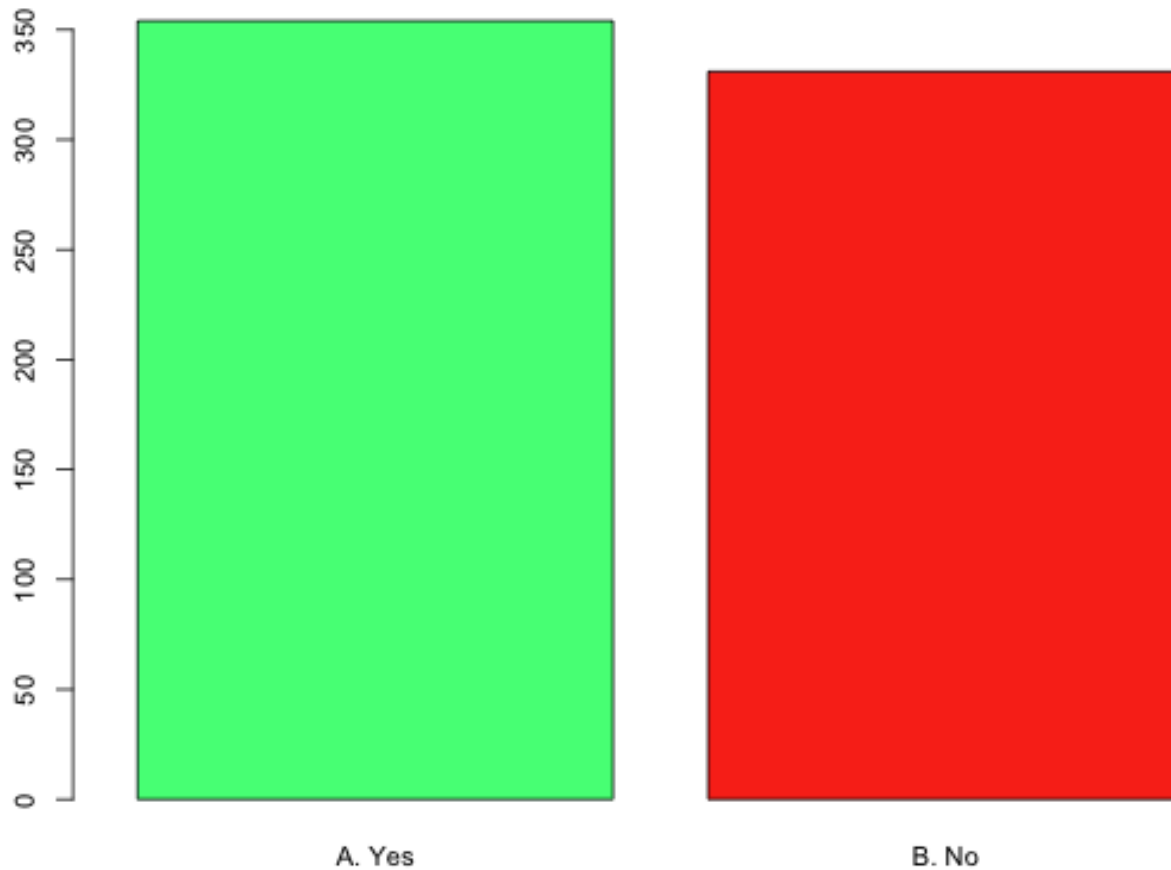


Would co-education* have a positive impact upon campus?

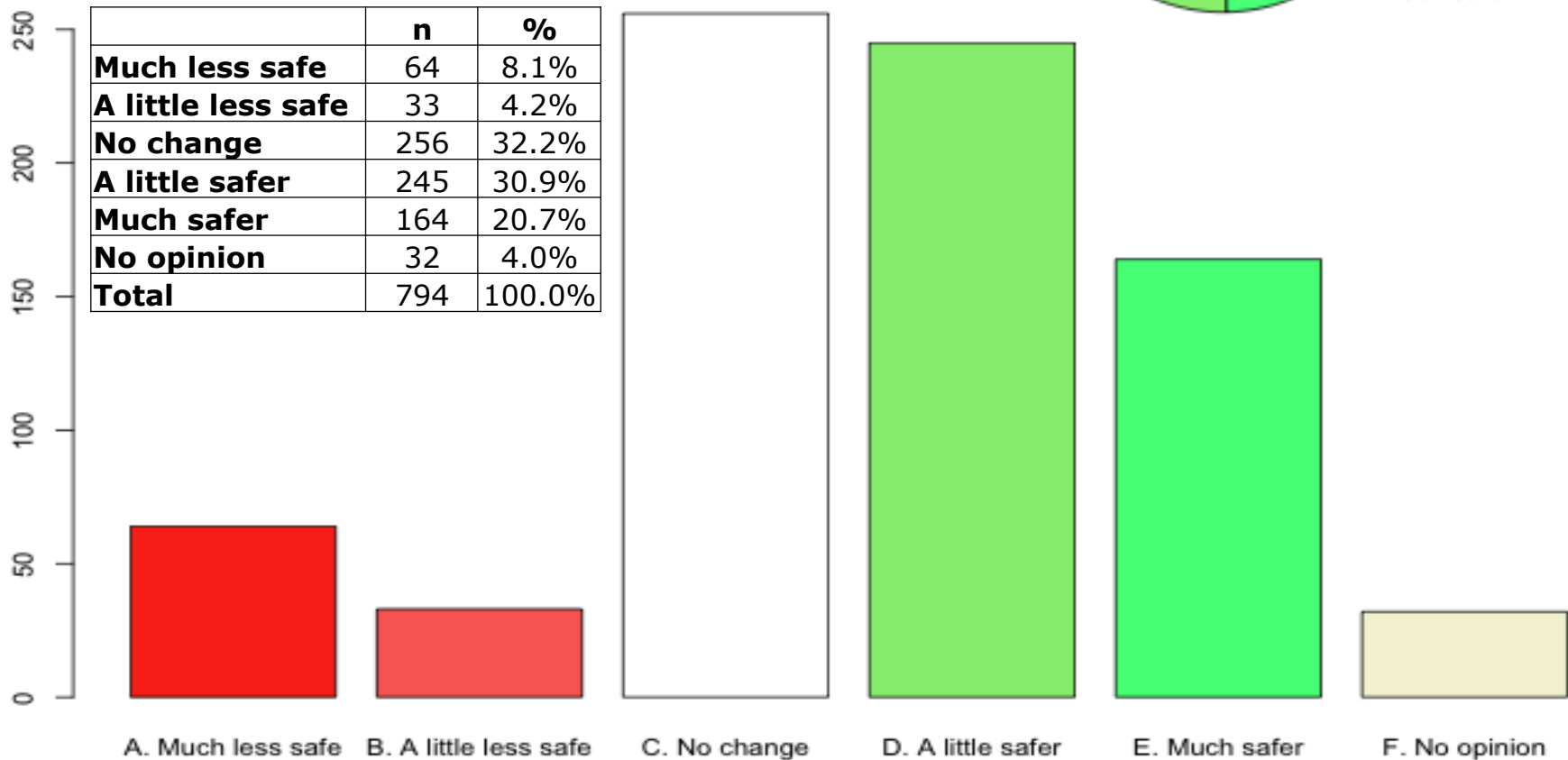
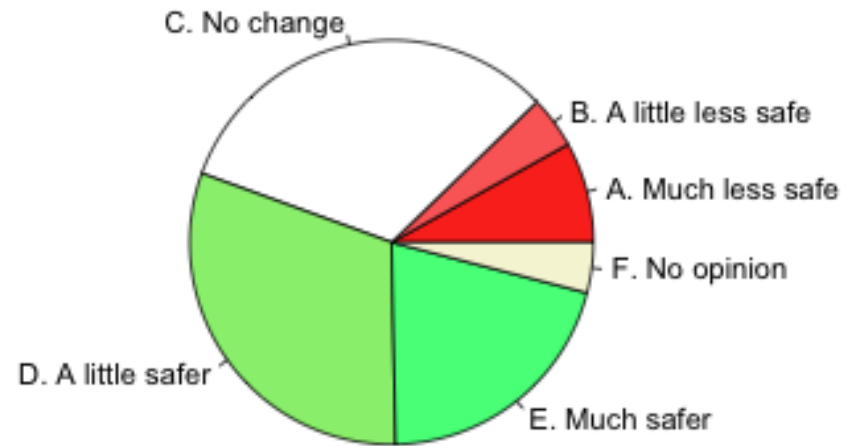

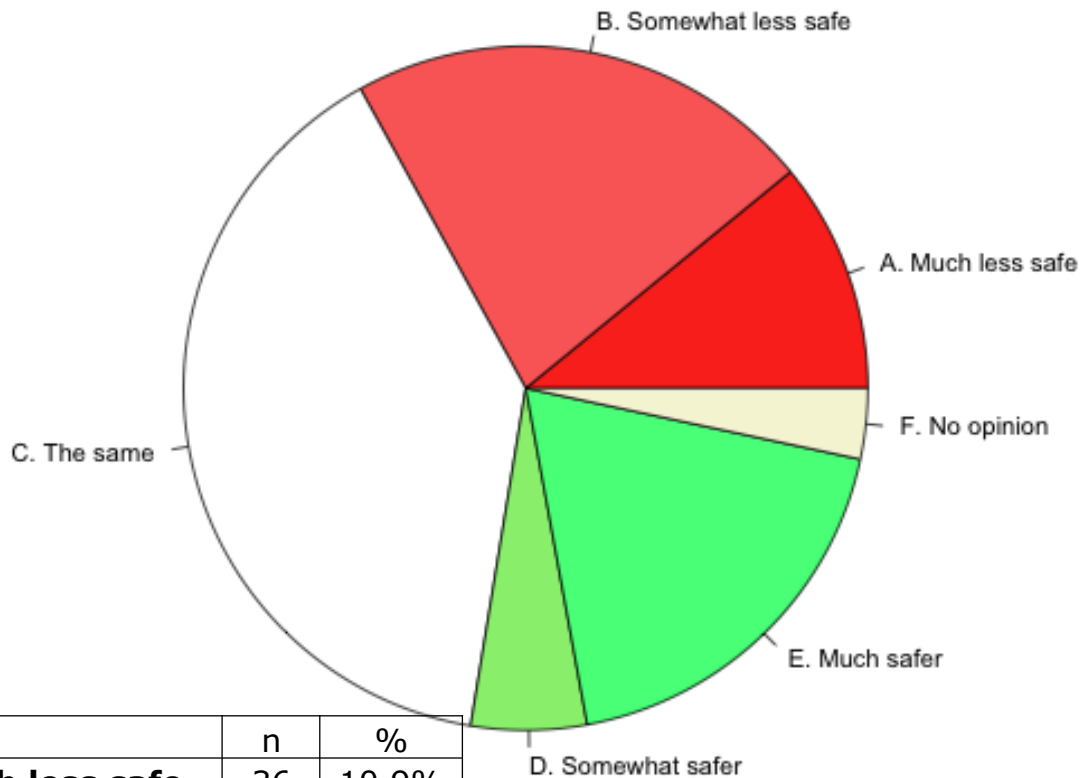
“What would be the impact of co-education* of housed fraternities upon safety of those spaces?”



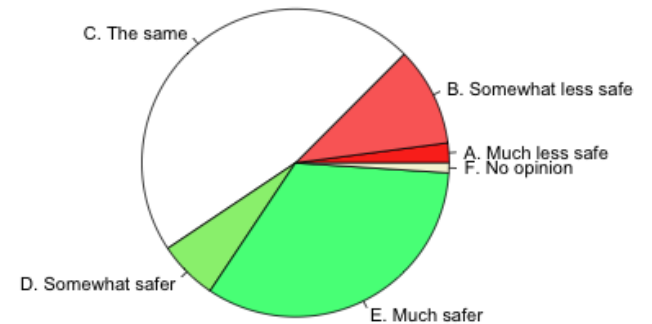

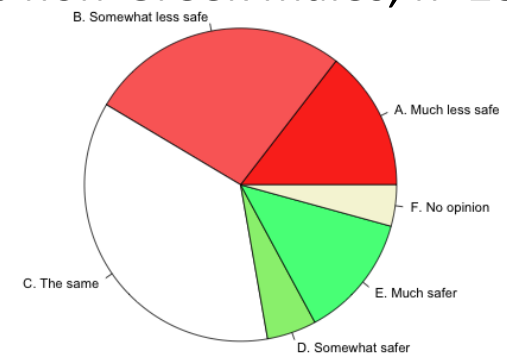
“How safe do you feel in fraternity spaces during parties compared to other party spaces on campus?” [all cis males]

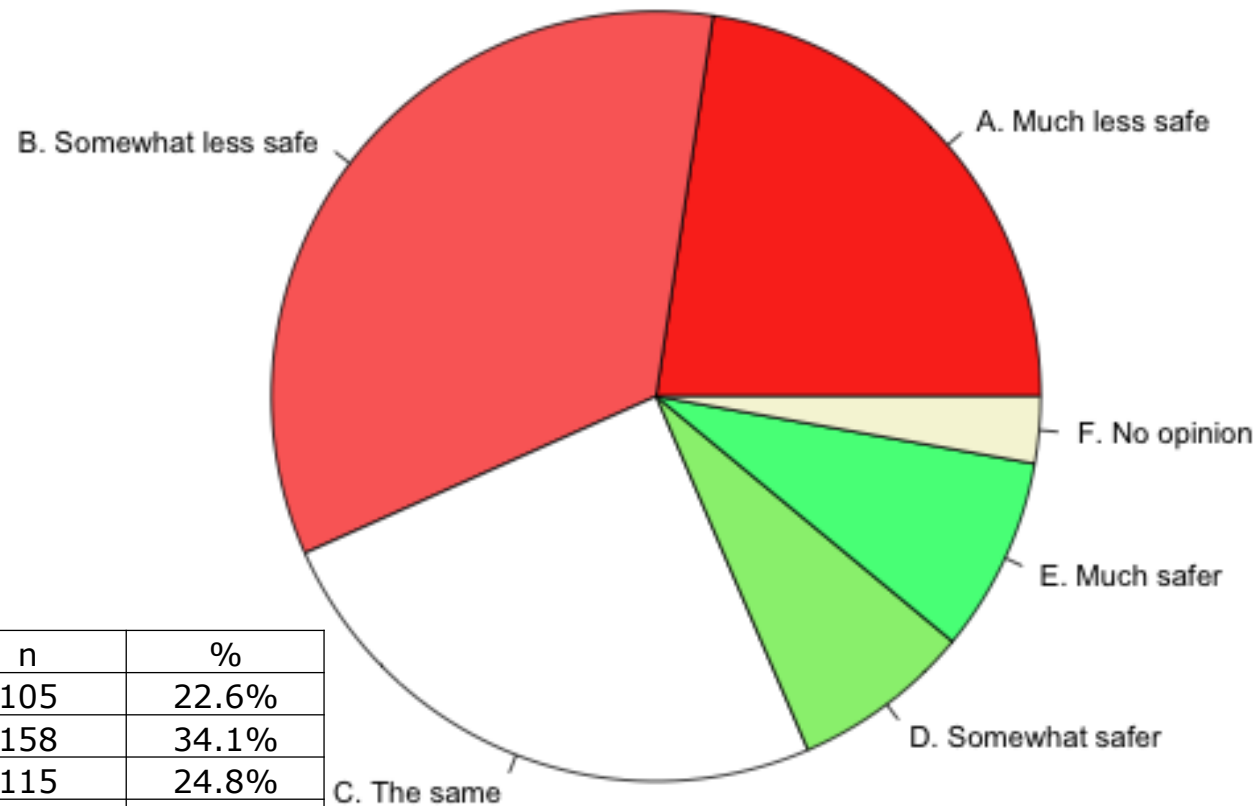

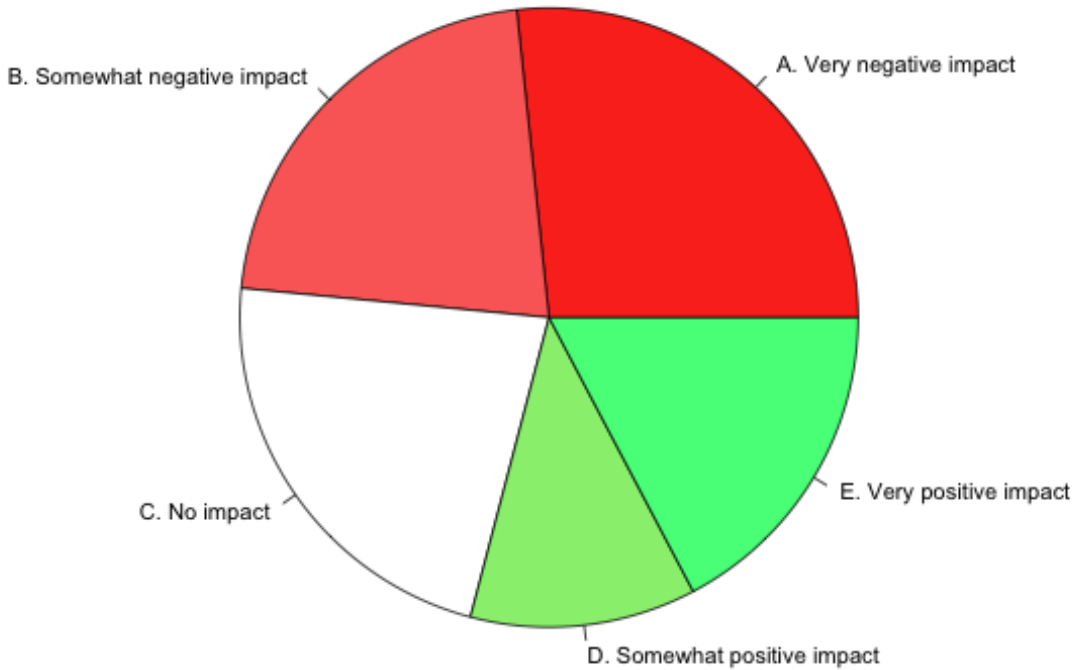

“How safe do you feel in fraternity spaces during parties compared to other party spaces on campus?” [not cis male]



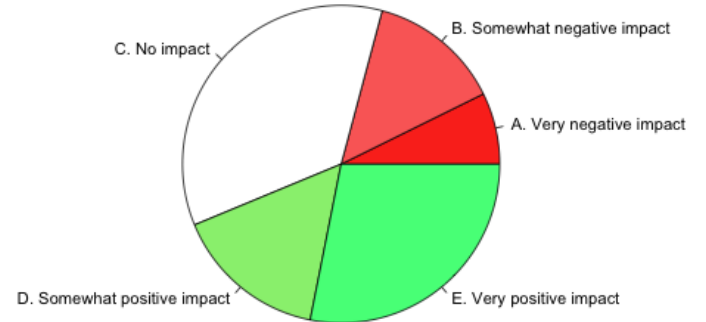

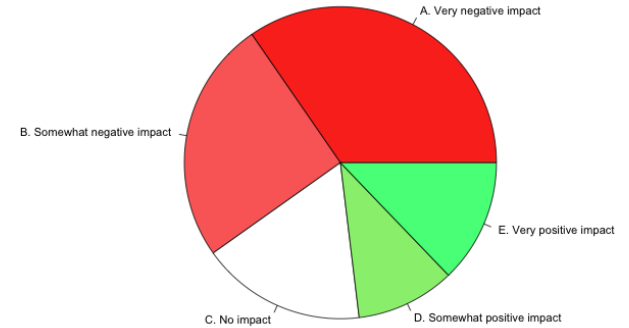

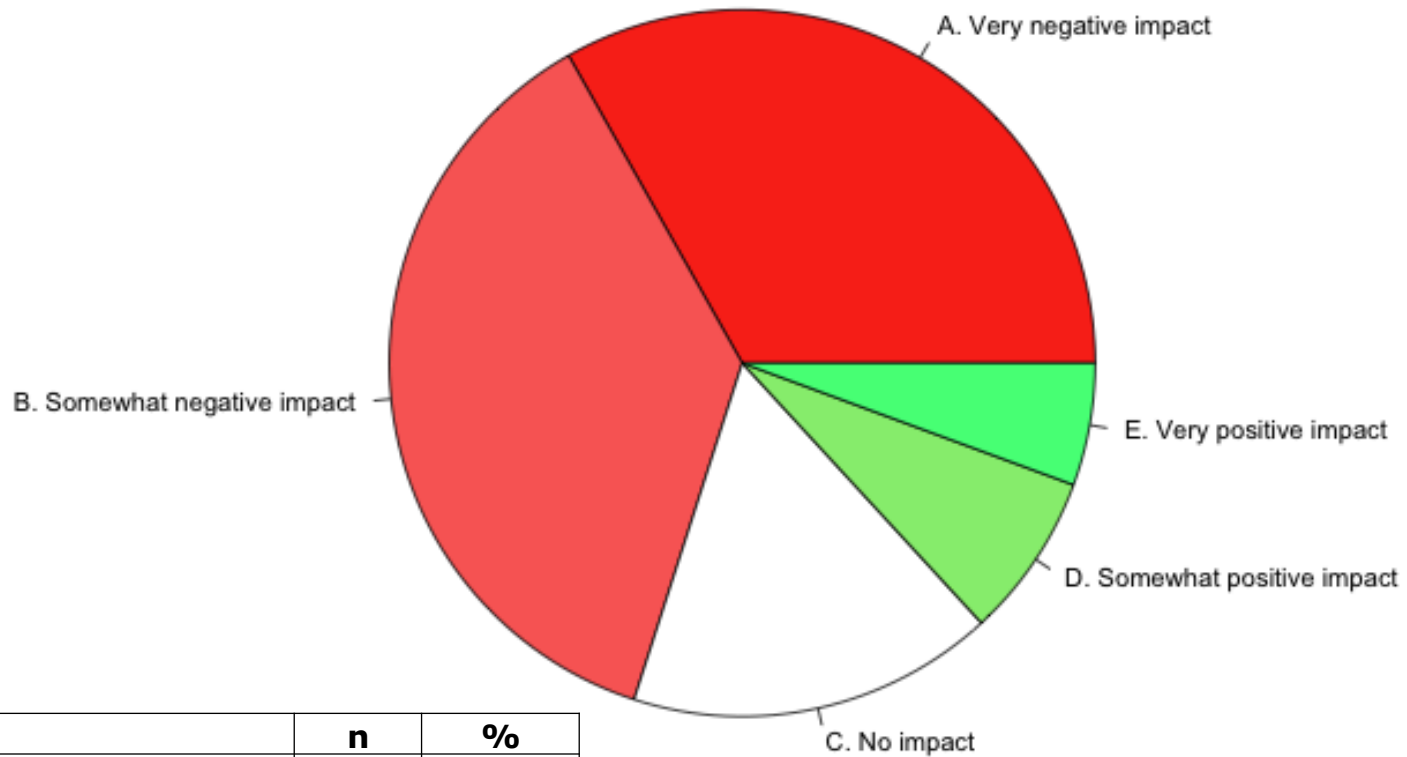

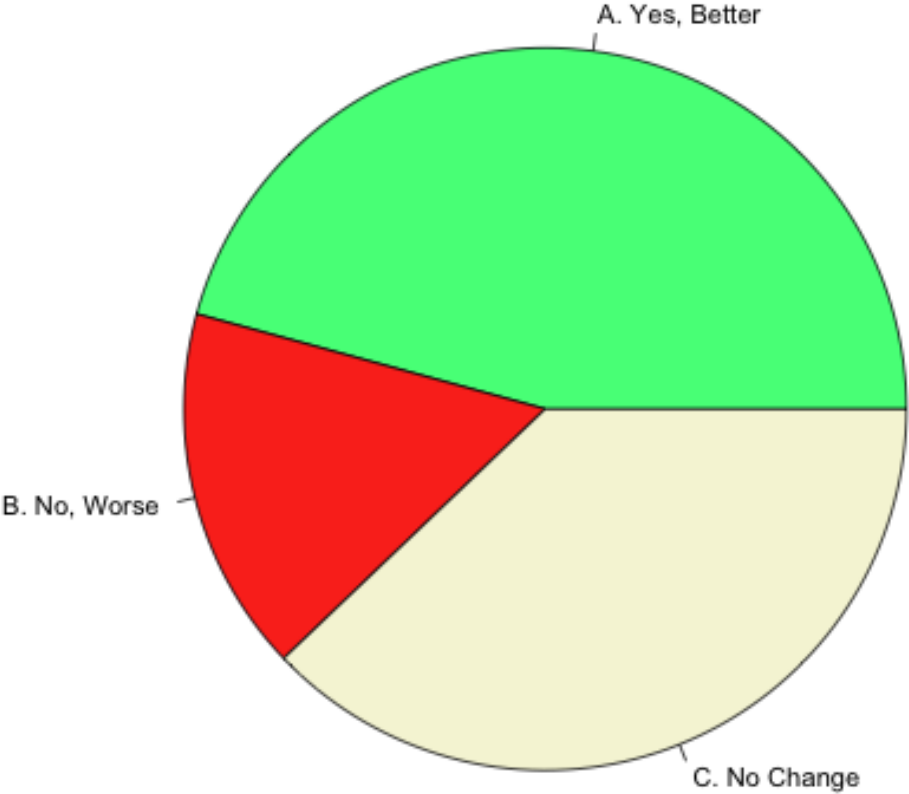


“What impact do you think the existence of fraternity spaces has on gender relations and gender equality on campus?” [not cis males]

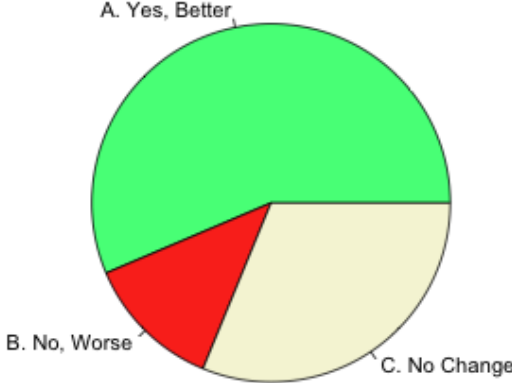

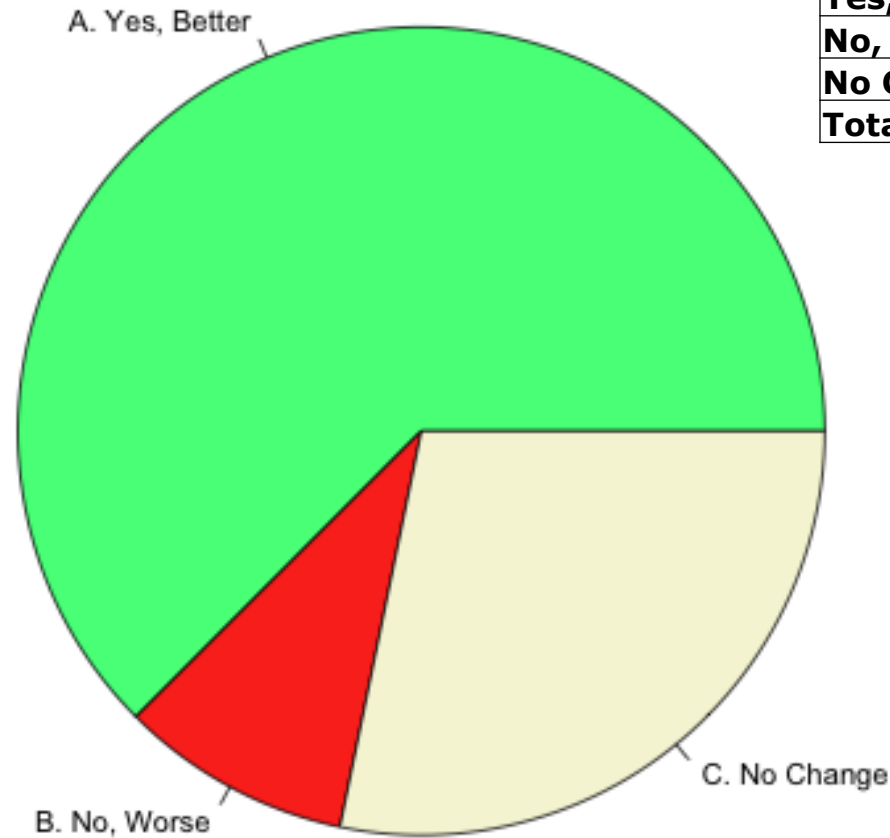

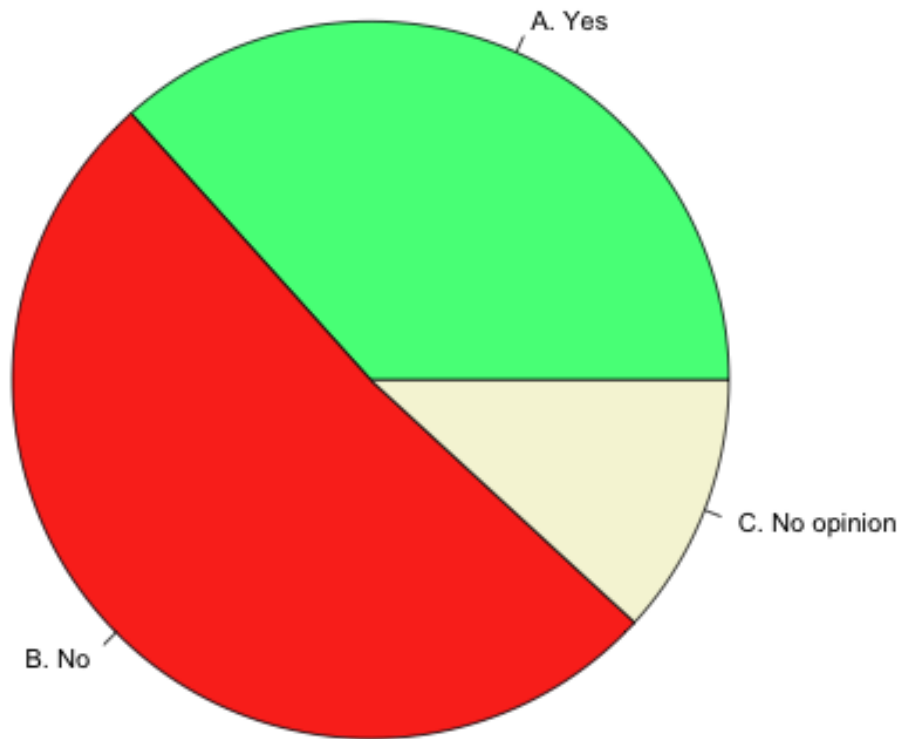


Would co-education* have a positive impact upon campus? (amalgamation) [not cis males]



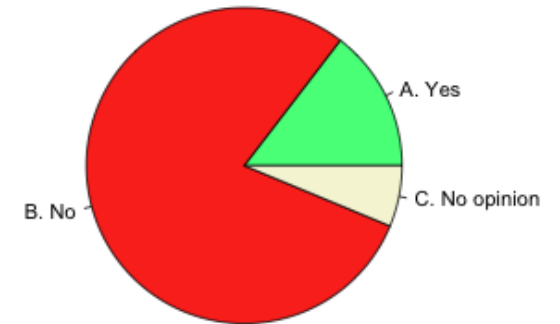

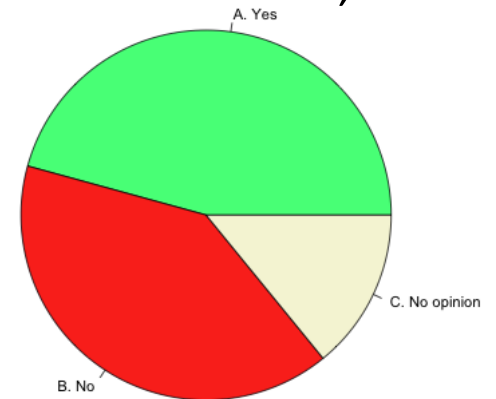

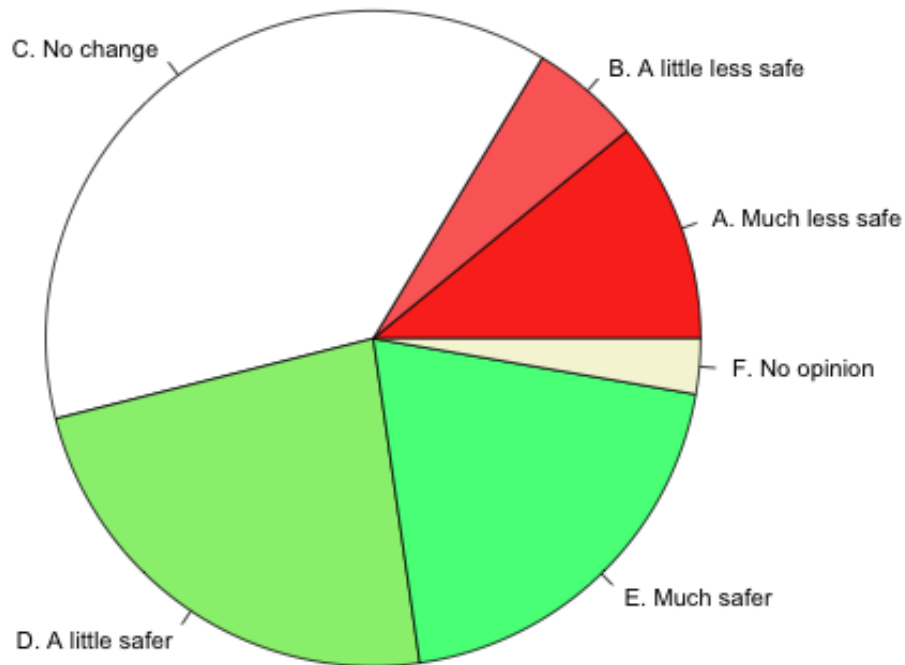


“Would co-education of housed fraternities* improve gender relations and gender equality on campus?” [not cis males]



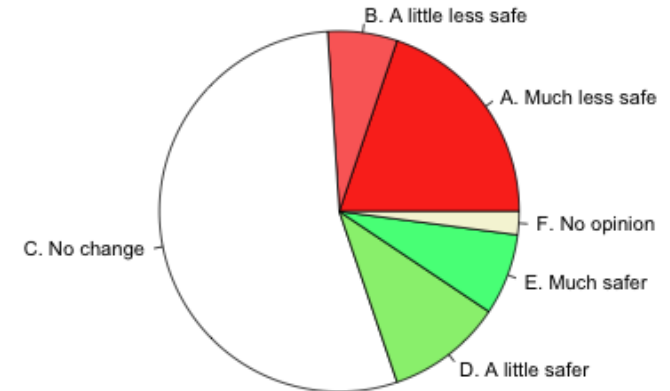

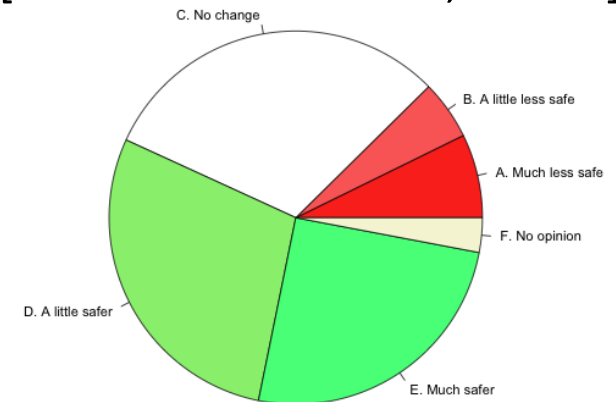

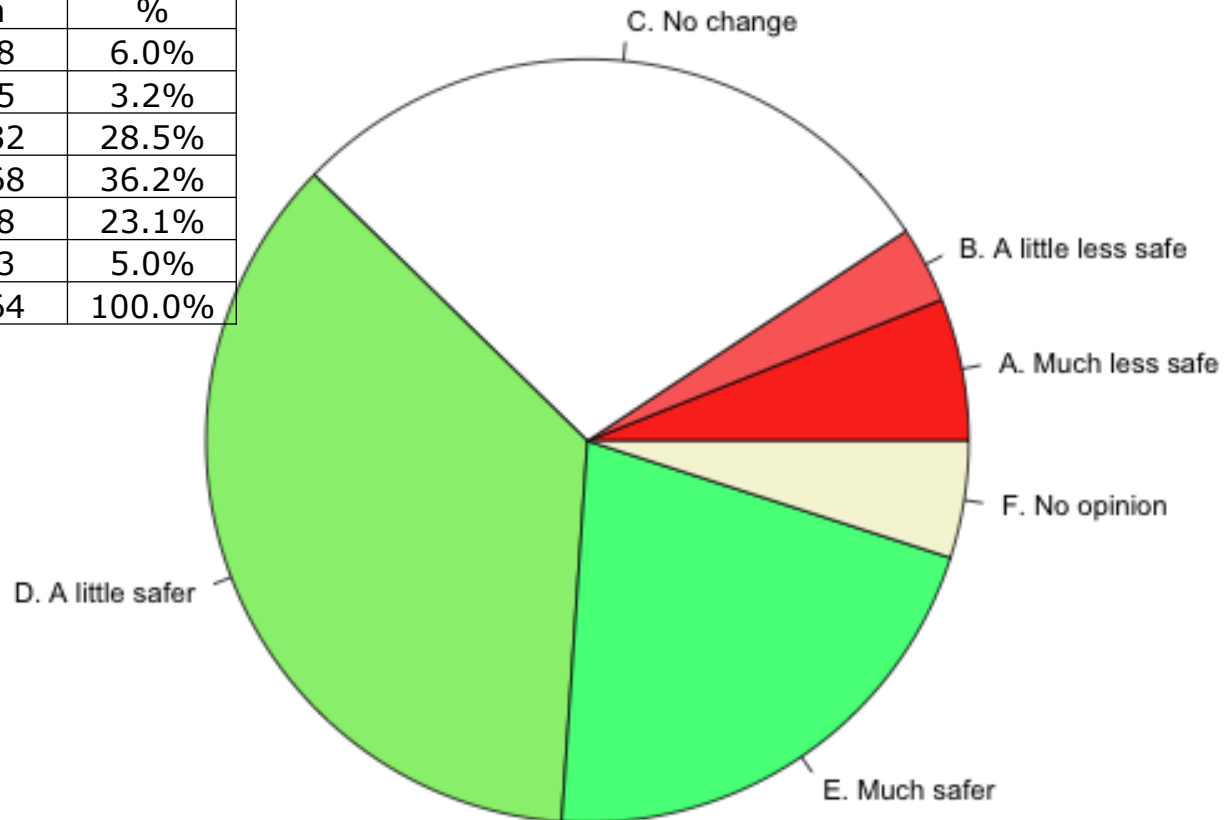

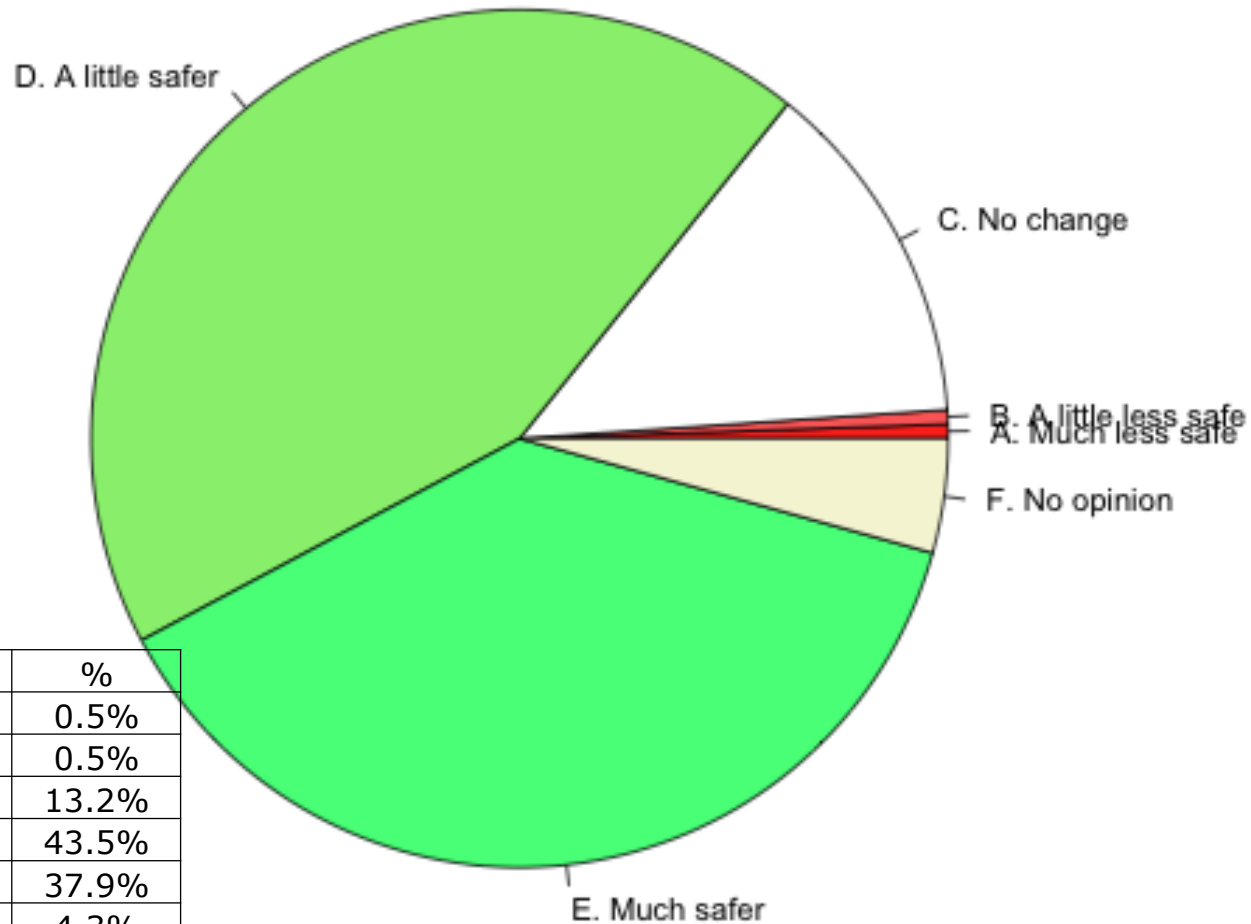


“What would be the impact of co-education* of housed fraternities upon safety of those spaces?” [not cis males]
